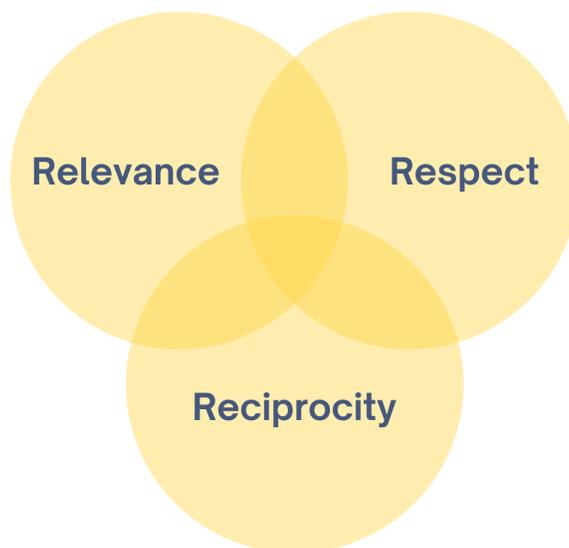
**Value and Duration:** \$35,000, for one year

### **Description:**

The Northwest Territories Network Environments for Indigenous Health Research (NT-NEIHR) is focused on creating a network between community members, Elders, and researchers with the goal of advancing health and wellness in the Northwest Territories and Yukon. ### **Goals of the Scholarship:**

The NT-NEIHR Doctoral Scholarship is intended to support students engaged in research related to Indigenous health and promoting health and wellbeing for Indigenous peoples in the Northwest Territories or Yukon. Applications will be assessed on the basis of their commitment to embodying the following values:



- The objectives and methodologies **respect** Indigenous bodies of knowledge and are driven from a strengths-based perspective.
- The objectives and methods are **relevant** to all participating members of the project.
- The researcher (applicant) demonstrates a **reciprocal** relationship between themselves and their community partners. This reciprocal relationship ensures that relevant knowledge flows in multiple directions: from the researcher to the community, and from the community to the researcher.

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### Eligibility Requirements:

- Self-identify as Indigenous (*First Nations, Métis, or Inuit*)
- Be a doctoral student enrolled in a health-related field
- Be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada
- Have not held an NT-NEIHR doctoral scholarship for more than 2 years prior to this application
- Submit a completed application and relevant supplemental documents prior to the deadline posted for the funding opportunity

### Details of Application Pieces:

- Activity/Project Proposal:
  - o Length: 2 pages, single spaced
  - o Include details on project background, research question, objectives, methodologies/methods, and what you hope to accomplish
  - o Include clear details of how the proposed project will have tangible impacts within the community and beyond the research environment
  - o Outline how the project will meet the goals of the scholarship in terms of respect, relevance, and reciprocity for the community (as described in the above section)
  - o Include details of any previous experiences in professional, academic or extracurricular activities that have prepared you with the knowledge and skills to do this research
  - o Describe the types of community partnerships in place that will help contribute to the success of the project
- Detailed Final Report:
  - o Length: 1 page, single spaced
  - o A narrative report of how the scholarship has contributed to your studies will be due at the end of the funding year (i.e., August 31, 2023)
  - o The report will be primarily used to help us improve the scholarship for future cycles, and may be included in future evaluations and reports. If you would like us to keep your responses out of the report, please let us know.
  - o Some potential questions to address:
    - How did the funds contribute to your personal/professional and project's success?
    - In what ways did the scholarship help advance your understanding of health and wellbeing for Indigenous Northerners?
    - What are some of the key learnings and take-aways that you've had during your studies this year?
    - Are there additional supports that you feel may be missing in your student experience?
